Sculpture Trail with American artist Randy Klein

To coincide with his exhibition of sculpture at GX Gallery in Camberwell, American artist Randy Klein will give a talk and lead a Sculpture Trail visiting a selection of his recent public work. The talk will examine the different approach to creating work in the studio and environmental works. Klein has created a large number of sculptures in public spaces in the UK. Several of these projects are in London, and the Sculpture Trail will visit eight completed projects located near GX Gallery. A minibus will be provided and advanced booking is advised.

The Sculpture Trail will visit projects which are not 'sculpture' in the usual sense.

Examples of sites to be visited:

- **The Friary Estate** - for this large, rambling housing estate in Peckham Klein has transformed the face of the largest block of flats into a tableau – with enamelled photos of the area on street level, and cut-out stainless steel woven through the balconies.
- **Paterson Park Parasol** - For a neglected park in Bermondsey, Klein has created a huge stainless steel umbrella engraved with personal responses by local people to the question 'What is a Park?'

This is also a chance to see Klein's first gallery exhibition of sculpture for over five years, 'Road'. A major sculpture, 'Road' dominates the gallery space. Sixteen ft. long, and seven ft. high, 'Road' is like a cross between the 'Ages of Man' and an American road movie. This piece has previously been exhibited at the European Academy and has been on loan to the Livesey Museum. This is its first showing in a London gallery. A series of sculpture poems will complete the exhibition.
